IV. Treasurer's Report

Treasurer

1. Review of Income Statement as of 06/30/2021

After six months in 2021, preliminary operating results are negative, with disbursements exceeding revenues by \$53,858 (at the end of last month the net position was a negative \$33,750). Revenue at the end of June is under budget by \$73,405 (\$382,747 received versus \$456,152 budgeted). Revenue is \$44,270 behind where we were at the end of June last year. Regular offerings, at \$346,924, fell short of the budgeted offerings of \$401,652 by \$54,728, and are \$42,586 below last year's amount of \$389,510 (general fund giving is about 10% behind last year). A month by month summary of offerings is provided in the graph entitled "ECOB 2021". Note that giving in every month this year has been below budget except for April. June 2021 giving (\$46,323) was well below budget, and much less than June 2020's giving (\$56,850). A 5 year history of general fund offerings compared to budgeted offerings is also provided in the graph entitled "ECOB YTD 6/30 COMPARISON."

Disbursements at the end of June are under budget by \$26,964 (\$436,605 actual spending versus \$463,569 budgeted spending) and \$49,432 more than last year. Resources spending, mainly due to elevator repairs, is \$51,255 above budget and \$98,101 more than last year. With the exception of Administration, spending in all other categories is under budget and is less than a year ago. Ministry Salaries & Benefits is significantly less than budget and a year ago, due mainly to Pastor Greg's departure.

Overall, as of 6/30/2021 we are in a preliminary net operating loss position of \$53,858, with income and expenses both under budget. Income is significantly less than a year ago and spending is significantly higher than a year ago. Last year at the end of June we were in a net gain position of \$39,844.

2. Cash Position, Building Project, and LT Investments at BFI

Our cash position at 6/30/2021 is \$1,824,787. This compares to our cash position a year ago of \$1,315,393. The large increase in cash is primarily due to Capital Campaign contributions. Just over \$1,631,000 of this cash is invested in a money market fund.

Contributions to the building project at 6/30/2021 totaled \$2,091,997 (\$170,674 in 2021). Non-operating budget building project costs to date are \$564,242 (\$159,080 in 2021). Net cash proceeds available for future building project spending is \$1,527,755.

The market value of all long-term memorial funds invested with the Brethren Foundation as of 6/30/2021 was \$2,608,032, which is up \$91,601 from the beginning of the year market value of \$2,516,431, reflecting

an investment gain, net of expenses, of \$91,601 (a total investment return for the year of approximately +3.6%). The investment return for June was +0.8%. As of 6/30/2021 our portfolio was invested \$1,300,457 (50%) in a Short-term investment fund and \$1,307,575 (50%) in a balanced fund (60% domestic stock fund, 40% bond fund). **Discussion & Comments** YTD giving statements going out via email next week. As is true with so many areas in our church community today, we will be discussing the role of the deacons as we move forward.
